Students will explore the world of science, technology, engineering and math. They will participate in hands-on activities and experiments.


#1: Sports Camp: June 10th – 21st

#4: Art Camp: July 22nd - August 2nd





Payments: Tuition is payable in advance. We do not mail or give out monthly statements. If you need a statement, please ask for one on the 1st of the month. Please pay tuition by cash, check, or money order. Payments are due on the 1st and late if received after the 3rd of the month. Semi-monthly payments are due on the 1st, late after the 3rd, and due on the 15th, late after the 17th, regardless of your child's attendance schedule. A \$25.00 late fee will be incurred if payment is not received in full by the due date(s) (no postmarks will be accepted), you will be ineligible for the cash discount, and your credit card will be charged. If the due date falls on a day El Rancho School is closed, on a weekend, or if you are on vacation, payment is due the prior day. If the school is unable to get a credit card authorization code for the tuition plus late fee, families have 5 school days to bring the account current with either cash or another credit card. If this is not accomplished your child(ren) will automatically be dropped from enrollment. Your child(ren) will not be able to return until the account is made current. Effective June 10, 2024

HOURS OF OPERATION: El Rancho School is open from 7:30 AM – 5:00 PM Monday – Friday. Summer camp hours are 8 AM-5PM daily. The school closes promptly at 5:00 PM. We have a late fee, not to generate revenue, but to strongly discourage parents from picking up their child/children after the school closes. Please keep in mind that 5:00 PM is when we lock the school and leave. If you are unavoidably late and must pick up your child after we close, please call us as soon as you know. Please bring a check or cash to pay the fee when you pick up your child after 5:00 PM. We will prepare a receipt the following day for a cash payment.

ATTENDANCE: Summer camp begins at 9:00 AM, however, students may arrive any time after 8AM. First through fourth-grade campers are not required to be signed in or out.

Classrooms are locked at 3:00 PM because it is dangerous to have any place on our campus that students can be alone and not supervised. Also, classrooms are cleaned and sanitized by the teacher before he/she leaves and locks the doors. Students are given several opportunities and reminders to get all of their things out of the classroom before being locked. Please do not ask school administrators to unlock a classroom for your child to get their things. Classrooms are opened every morning at 8AM.

Student lunches and snacks need to be brought from home ready to eat. Unfortunately, we don't have the facilities to store lunches and snacks in the school refrigerator or to heat meals for students. **Students are not allowed to share food**. All food items that are not eaten are to be taken home, not thrown away, so the parents know what the child has eaten, or not eaten.

Gum, soda, chocolate in any form, and candy are not permitted at school, in student lunches, snacks, or at class parties. Please do not send them. We strongly recommend that sugar or sugar substitute treats be omitted from student lunches. The following are a few suggestions that can be served at parties: crackers and cheese, meat slices, vegetables and dip, dried and fresh fruit, 100% juice drinks and popsicles, yogurt, sandwiches, deviled eggs, pasta, casseroles, muffins, and salads. We have found that our students do not notice that their snacks are sugar-free as long as they are pretty. Often we hear that children think a party in itself is a treat and special snacks only contribute to the overall excitement.

Please do not bring your pet on campus. Our liability insurance does not cover pets. It is not safe to leave dogs in unattended vehicles in the parking lot.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR: Students must abide by posted classroom and playground rules. Children are expected to pick up after themselves. Students must treat others with respect. We expect all students to be courteous, demonstrate good manners, and follow directions. Students will not push, shove, hit, kick, spit, bite, trip, bully, cyberbully, forcefully handle other children, call other people names, or threaten others. Children must not act as if they are playing with weapons. Weapons are never to be brought to school (guns, razor blades, knives of all sizes, etc.); these are grounds for expulsion. The school does not allow students to use profanity or language "unbecoming" children.

Children may not share hair combs or brushes at school. Students who have lice or nits will be sent home, and may not return to school until they are nit-free. Shampoo treatments do not kill all nits. Please request lice information from the front office if necessary.

Parents may not go in or use student restrooms. Please ask for directions to an adult restroom.

Occasionally a parent on campus notices a child using inappropriate language or behavior with another student. Please, do not address such a situation personally; tell a staff member what you observed and it will be handled by one of our staff members, perhaps not at that moment, but as soon as the appropriate person becomes available.

At parent gatherings off campus, like student's birthday parties, El Rancho School staff members and school policies are often a topic of conversation. The school requests that parents be careful that students are not within hearing if negative comments are made. Such comments lead to students using disrespectful behavior to that staff member and are told to the staff member by the child, creating ill will. If you have a problem, dispute, or concern, please address it respectfully with the appropriate staff member so that problem solving can be accomplished. An administrator is always on campus, but may not be immediately available. If they are not, please leave a message or note to telephone you.

Illicit drugs are strictly prohibited on campus, as are smoking and drinking alcohol. We can't release a child to an adult who looks/acts/smells as if they are under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Please do not place our staff in the position of trying to determine if you are capable of safely transporting a child.

Birthday Party Invitations We want to eliminate any hurt feelings among the children and hope this policy will be useful to all. We have developed a system for invitations to efficiently reach families with plenty of time for RSVPs. If you would like to distribute invitations at El Rancho School, please follow the guideline: Bring in enough invitations for all the campers in your child's group at least two weeks before the party. Note: If you choose to invite a few children to a party, we are not able to distribute those invitations. El Rancho School does not hand out school/class directories, so you may want to ask the parents of your child's friends for their phone numbers.

Inappropriate Messages: Suggestive, unpleasant, or inappropriate words or designs on backpacks, lunch or book bags, binders, book covers, bathing suits, hats, gloves, games, or clothing is strictly prohibited.

Consequences

The school will notify parents either in writing or by phone if their child misbehaves or does not follow the school rules. If the behavior is believed by the administration to warrant the child being picked up from school, the parent will be notified immediately, and the child must be picked up within the hour. Repeated or very severe misbehavior is grounds for suspension and/or expulsion at the principal's, or her designee, sole discretion.

Dress Code

Clothing: Students should wear clean, modest, well-maintained, proper-fitting clothing of their choice, using the general guide of appropriateness. Students may not wear costumes, pajamas, or "low-rider" shorts or pants to school. Spaghetti strap tops (straps must be at least one inch wide), tube tops, midriff tops that show the stomach, shorts with an inseam shorter than five inches, basketball jerseys without an undershirt, or other immodest clothing is inappropriate.

Bathing suits: Bathing suits must be modest. Girls may not wear string or very small bikinis.

Shoes: Your child's safety at school is our most important goal; therefore, children may not wear footwear that has slick soles, low or high heels, flip-flops, or any footwear that hinders their movement during active play, such as sandals without a back strap. Closed-toe sandals may be worn, provided they have a back strap.

Jewelry: Campers may wear one small pair of stud earrings. Students may not have any other body-piercing jewelry or visible tattoos. Cosmetic make-up is not allowed.

Hair: The children's hair can't be dyed or bleached, shaved to the skin in non-traditional styles, all over the head, or worn in spikes, or other "punk" styles like a Mohawk. Hair will be brushed and look neat. Hair "tails" for boys are not acceptable.

If you are unsure if your child's item may be a prohibited item, please re-read the school's Character Development Program on our website www.elranchoschool.com. If your item is not in the spirit of this program, it is inappropriate. If your child violates this policy, a note will be sent home to you. we will not discuss the violation with your child. Illness Policy

ILLNESSES: Please do not "mask" childhood illness symptoms, such as high temperature, by giving Tylenol or other medicines, and then send your child to school. It is unfair to the child, their classmates, and school staff. Ill children are expected to be picked up within one hour of the time that the parent is contacted. Children who are ill or are contagious must not be brought to school. Unvaccinated students may be temporarily excluded from the program should an outbreak of two or more cases arise.

School administration notes, on our Illness Board, any students who call in or are sent home ill. We record the time, the illness, and when the child may return to school. Please make sure you do not bring your child back to school before this date. Our Illness Board is located by the school office.

Ailment	The child may return to El Rancho School
Flu and Fever	No fever and 48 hrs. after fever-reducing medicine has worn off
Diarrhea and Vomiting	24 hours after the last bout
Chickenpox	When all pox have been scabbed over
Fifths Disease	48 hours after the fever has broken
Impetigo	24 hours after the cream has been applied; the area must be covered if oozing with gauze
	and medical tape (Adhesive bandages do not stay on well enough.)
Head Lice	When all lice and nits are gone
Ring Worm	24 hours after treated with a topical regimen
Pink Eye	24 hours after antibiotic treatment
Excess/colored mucus	No fever and a note from the child's doctor stating that the child is not contagious
Coughing	24 hours after cough is gone

It is our policy that students with head lice or "nits" (eggs) in their hair will be excluded from school and must be picked up immediately. To return to school, their hair must be treated and nit-free.

Medicine is only administered by our office staff. By law, this includes aspirin, cough drops, sunscreen, and chapstick containing SPF. If your child needs medication to be administered at your child's lunchtime, please fill out the Permission to Administer Medicine form located in the front office. All medication must be in the original container with the child's name on it and must be picked up on the last day the medicine is to be administered. Further directions are on the permission form.

If your child needs medication to be administered, please fill out the **Permission to Administer Medicine** form located in the front office. **All medicine must be walked into the school by the parent, provided in the original container, and have the child's name on the container.** Parents are responsible for locking medication, which needs to be refrigerated, in our preschool kitchen refrigerator.
